County Canoe Race



The **County Canoe Race** returns on **Sunday 28th September 2008**.

This 7 mile race takes place on the River Chelmer and is open to all Scouts, Explorers, Network members and leaders who possess at least their BCU (British Canoe Union) 1 Star Certificate (old), or the UKCC One Star (new), or Paddle Power Passport.

The race costs £5 per person and includes the permit to canoe on the river, certificates, and trophies for the winner of each class.

The race starts at Hoe Mill Lock (807 082) at 10:00 and finishes in Chelmsford (713 064). Paddlers should supply their own Scout registered craft, pad-

dle, and a suitable buoyancy aid. If you want to take part but don't have access to a canoe / are unable to transport it, please contact us on the number below to see if alternative arrangements can be made.

There are 2 classes of canoe:

- Open (Canadian style, paddle with one blade)
- Kayak (closed cockpit, two bladed paddle)

There are 3 classes of participant:

- Scout
- Explorer
- Network / Leader.

Air Activities

Our Cubs have worked on a number of badges this year, including Local Knowledge, Entertainer, Creative, Astronomer, Map Reader and Air Activities. We spent a month on each badge and completed a variety of activities, much more than was required to earn the badge.

For Air Activities the Cubs learnt how a plane stays up in the air, they built and tested models and investigated how the steering surfaces affected the flight. They had a paper airplane competition that tested their planes abilities in a variety of situations.

They also learned about different liveries on planes, and were tested using a set of 60 flashcards I had created.



They learnt how to recognise various planes by their silhouettes.

They were taught about the dangers of being on an airfield and acted out a play to teach others. We also looked at how weather affected the safety of flying.

They looked at different types of flying



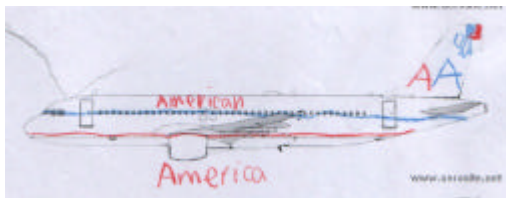
objects, from balloons to jets, and also got to fly a model airplane and a model helicopter!

The were tested on all these things and had to complete a worksheet, a quiz on liveries and silhouettes, and take part in the model making.

All we need to do now to finish off the badge is visit a museum or airfield. We are planning to go to the RAF Museum in Northwest London.

Crisis Command



This year our Troop program included a couple of nights run by the leaders. One of these was Crisis Command. The Scouts were sat in their Patrols in a darkened room and were told they would have to deal with a serious incident as part of an exercise. They could only send messages to the outside world via pieces of paper to a leader in another room and they would have to deal with the incident and complete a police report form at the end of the exercise.

A red flashing light was switched on and the timer started ticking on the display on the wall.

Over the next hour and a half the Patrols had to deal with an accident where a car swerved and hit a lorry and a tanker hit a railway bridge.

They had to manage the traffic, get units to the scene, investigate and track down the people responsible for the accident and deal with the problems on the scene.

The Patrols started slowly at first but reports started flooding in from members of the public, units on the scene, helicopters overhead and command. The media hassled them for reports, conflicting witness statements had to be unravelled and they had to deal with the difficulty of getting recovery and emergency units to the scene through a 3 mile tailback on the road.

All in all, with a little help from command, they dealt with it as best they could and came up with some fairly sensible ideas. However none of the patrols managed the traffic problem which severely restricted what they could achieve on the scene as help found it difficult to get to the bridge. Only one patrol came up with a silly idea, asking an ambulance crew to search for a suspect, that brought a swift rebuke from the ambulance and police service!

I would recommend it as a different sort of night for Scouts and Explorers. The original idea came from:

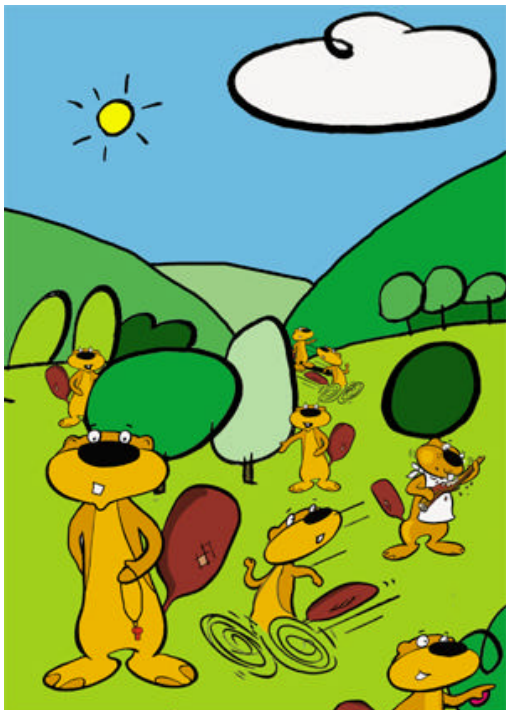
